The Polish Province of the **Congregation of Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Christian Charity** reports on the use of funds donated by the IFC TOR to provide assistance to those affected by the war in Ukraine.

Thank you on behalf of the Polish Province of the Congregation of the Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Christian Charity, but also thank you especially on behalf of those who have benefited in various ways from the financial assistance donated by IFC TOR.

These needy people remain so close to us, and yet often nameless, because in fear for their lives or the lives of their loved ones, they are afraid to be photographed lest someone use the photos for blackmail. That is why only some of the photos are included in the Report.

From the IFC TOR we received the amount of 14,000 euros, which after currency conversion was 64,000 PLN.

We allocated one part of the amount to help refugees from Ukraine staying in Poland, and the other part we donated through trusted people to help the victims, who for various reasons (ill health, lack of money for travel and many others) did not leave Ukraine, and were left there without means of subsistence (especially without food, medicines...).

In detail, it looks as follows:

- PLN 15,000 - to help children orphaned by the war staying in Zhytomyr and Grodek - money transferred through the Pallottine Sisters, who have outposts there and minister among these children;

- 15, 000 PLN - for the victims staying at the St. Michael the Archangel parish in Lviv - Sichow (for food, medicines and school supplies);

- PLN 5,000 - for food and clothing for the aggrieved in Horochow;

- PLN 15,000 - for the purchase of food and delivery by the Brothers of the Holy Spirit Society to the needy and starving in Kharkov;

- PLN 3,000 - for the purchase of paint and needed materials to furnish shelters for children in Cherkasy (200 km from Kiev);

- PLN 5,000 - support for development: purchase of necessary items and equipment (refrigerators, washing machines,...) for daily functioning for refugees from Ukraine staying in Człuchów - where our sisters minister;

- PLN 6,000- to help Ukrainian children studying in Polish schools in Warsaw (buying food, warm clothes and shoes, school supplies) - where our sisters work.

The total amount is 64 000 PLN.

Many thanks to all those who support the aid for refugees and those affected by the war in Ukraine. Thank you for your big heart, love and solidarity with those who suffer the most. We pray and trust that the hostilities in Ukraine will be ended as soon as possible.
